
Learning from the Great Unmade Places of Australia

Introduction







Key paradigms and how they may emerge

Sustaining the **health and environment of all citizens**... the two issues will become inseparable ...this should be the prime aim of a variety of design related subjects and overall courses

Introducing students (and the profession) to the **creative client...** with all the complexity, confusion and richness that this involves

Develop a detailed working knowledge of the unique aspects of the Australian environment by immersing students in the great made and unmade places.... This may involve universities of the road (or the bush track), ".... letting places get into them".

No amount of clever amero-euro-centric design studio education will be a substitute.

To greatly assist with this process we should, as a matter of urgency, **rescue the library** of Aboriginal knowledge of this country.

Make a simple choice of direction...which pattern do we wish to pursue, teach, make, discuss and encourage to emerge...

the pattern of the surface, decoration, form, shape, colour and mythologies **or**

the pattern that incorporates fundamental connections between the people and places.

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
