

FHBH 9 the reason fix work was required

The reason for fix work being needed in the FHBH 9 program follows the national trend (see current national maintenance breakdown at left), with less **damage** and **faulty** work and a corresponding increase in **routine** maintenance work.

For over 20 years tenant damage has been a relatively low cause of safety and health fix work in house maintenance.

FHBH 9: volume of fix work: comparison with another federal government program

The quantity of fix work completed depends on a variety of factors:

- the overall scope of the work items given the condition of the houses at Survey Fix 1,
- the cost and complexity of each item and
- the priority of the item (one high priority item may take the budget from many low priority items).

The amount of work done per house during this program has risen and the reporting completed without a fix work being undertaken has risen marginally.
