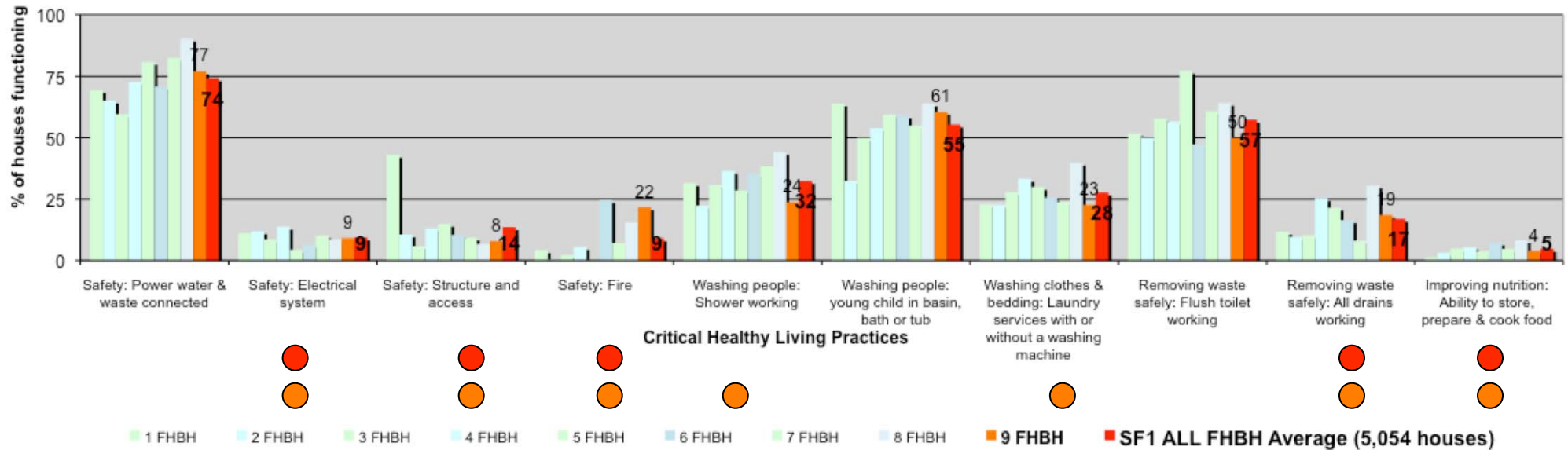


The complete FHBH program 1999-2011 House function at Survey Fix 1

Fixing Houses for Better Health program 1999-2011 Survey Fix 1 before any fix work commenced.
Data represents 5,054 houses in 111 projects



Comparison

Survey Fix 1: From FHBH 1 to 9 there are positive trends in house function in 3 Critical Healthy Living Practices with a further one CHLP showing marginal improvement.

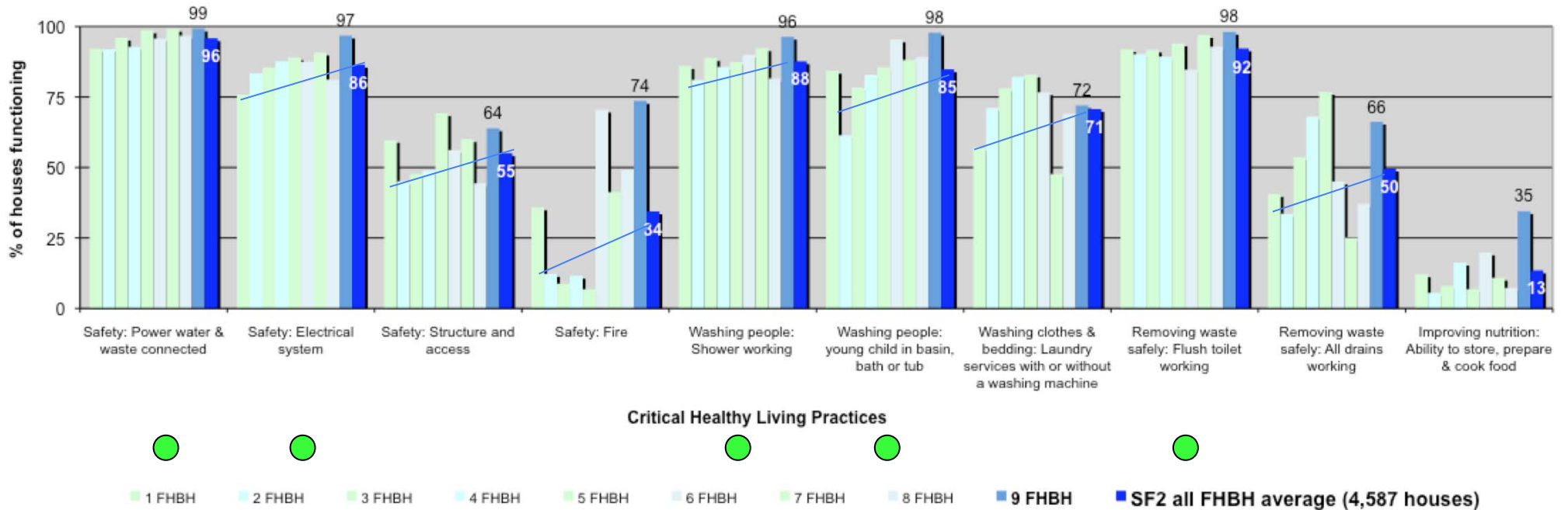
The data indicate consistently very poor overall scores. There is no baseline safety or health function improvement in Indigenous housing indicated from this data. This is despite the National Indigenous Housing Guide being available for most of this 12 year period with a clear priority given to the above CHLP measures.

Less than 25% of houses function in 5 of the 10 CHLP categories, ●
Less than 50% of the houses function in 7 of the 10 CHLP categories. ●

House function at Survey Fix 2

Fixing Houses for Better Health program 1999-2011 Survey Fix 2, after fix work was completed.
Data represents 4,587 houses in 106 projects



Comparison

Survey Fix 2:

There is a clear upward trend in the results achieved after fix work has been completed in 7 of the CHLPs.

The FHBH summary average data indicate improved overall program average scores at Survey Fix 2 compared to Survey Fix 1 showing:

- only **1 of the 10 CHLPs at SF2** has less than 25% of houses functioning compared with **5 CHLPs at SF1**
- only **2 of the 10 CHLPs at SF2** have less than 50% of the houses functioning compared with **7 CHLPs at SF1**
- and in **5 of the 10 CHLPs at SF2** show **75% of houses now function** (min 85%) compared with **0 CHLPs at SF1** ●
